APPROVAL OF SUMMARY MINUTES

• Board Meeting of September 25, 2018

Mr. Martinez moved to approve the Summary Minutes. Ms. Weinberg seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT & TPO REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

Mr. Rodriguez briefed Members on the following matters:

- Update on SR 836 construction Projects:
- Project 83628 to be completed April 2019 opening of the Le Jeune road. ramp eastbound to northbound access to Miami International Airport. The Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) at 57th Avenue will be opening December 12, 2018. Also opening are the westbound ramps at SR 836/27th Avenue and the 17th Avenue ramps.
- There will be major traffic shifts occurring at 87th Avenue in November
- The Notice to Proceed was issued for the 836/1395 Project
- The Interlocal Agreement with Miami-Dade County for the Dolphin Park and Ride Project was finalized.
- He along with Board members Weinberg and Meyer attended the 86th Annual IBTTA Conference in Baltimore, MD. The theme for the upcoming year is "Mobility as a Service".

- November 26-28, 2018 The Florida Automated Vehicles Summit will be held in Tampa; and Miami will be hosting the 2019 Summit.
- The TPO topic this month was the SMART Plan demonstration projects. Staff at the TPO showed there have been 13 small demonstration projects have been implemented throughout the community. These are partnership between municipalities, the county and the State of Florida.
- TPO Participation Fee As a result of MDX receiving a 2nd invoice from the TPO to pay a "participation fee," Mr. Rodriguez informed Members that last year the Board voted not to pay this fee because MDX is an implementation agency similar to FDOT and not a municipal entity. The reason MDX took this position was to avoid potential conflicts. Mr. Rodriguez further explained that one of the things the TPO wants to do with the participation fee is hire a federal and state lobbyist to pursue the SMART Plan. If this Board decides to remit the requested participation fee then a quarterly report from the TPO on how these monies are spent would be recommended for accountability purposes.
- Ms. Boucle, TPO Executive Director addressed the Board and entertained questions.
- Ms. Smith Fano read the following statement on the record

"Although we were informed that this TPO assessment would be used for, but not limited to paying for lobbyist, events, and other expenses that were strictly prohibited from being paid for with the TPO federally funded dollars, in reality MDX would have No control over what these assessments would pay for with MDX toll dollars.

Fellow Board Members we have always participated in many projects for the betterment of the community with values far more than \$22,000. The Dolphin Park and Ride for example at over \$11 million. I am sure you will agree that MDX has always been a good and fair partner when approached to participate in various initiatives, not only with the TPO but with any of our partner agencies or government bodies.

As a Governor appointee, on the MDX Board and the TPO, I believe that the Governor would not be in agreement with the assessment disbursement with toll paid dollars. Therefore, with due respect. I move that MDX not fund the recurring \$22,000 TPO assessment with toll payer dollars, and maintain the same principles that were discussed and jointly agreed upon last year."

Commissioner Edmonson seconded the motion. Secretary Wolfe opposed the motion stating that it's important for MDX to participate. The motion was approved.

Therefore, revenue will be recognized in November 2018.

Year to Date Fee Revenue is below budgeted forecast by \$573,000. This is mainly due to the State CCSS back office, which waived fees due to the transition.

MDX PROPERTY ACQUISITION POLICY

REQUESTED ACTION:

MOTION TO APPROVE:

Proposed revisions to the MDX Property Acquisition Policy.

COMMITTEE HISTORY:

The item was endorsed by the Finance, Policy & Planning Committee on November 13, 2018.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

The MDX Property Acquisition Policy (PAP) authorizes MDX to acquire property interests that are required for projects identified in the Board approved Five-Year Work Program. Since the Kendall Parkway Project is anticipated to create robust ROW activity, the Executive Director (ED) directed staff to evaluate the current PAP for effectiveness and efficiency.

Based on Staff's collective experience gained through the MDX ROW program, staff has identified a number of revisions that will help streamline the process of acquiring the large number of properties (estimated 600 parcels) required for the Kendall Parkway Project without sacrificing Board oversight. The proposed revisions are intended to clarify and streamline the process of the acquisition of parcels and the handling of business damages claims.

CURRENT PROCESS FOR THE ACQUISITION OF PARCELS

The following is a summary of the process of the acquisition of a parcel under the current MDX policy:

Step 1 - A specific project and the Right of Way needed to complete the project alignment is identified.

Step 2 - The MDX Board approves an estimated specific Project ROW Budget as part of the MDX Five Year Work Program to fund acquisition of real property deemed essential for the specific Project(s).

Steps 3 & 4 - The MDX OECI Committee endorses a Project Resolution & individual Parcel Resolution(s). The MDX Board approves the Project & individual Parcel Resolution that declares that i) the Project/Parcel will serve a public purpose and ii) that in order to construct the Project, it is necessary to acquire interests in real property through negotiated conveyance or

Eminent Domain procedures and iii) authorizes the ED, and all others designated to act on his behalf, to implement the provisions of the Project/Parcel Resolution. The Project and Parcel Resolutions are two separate actions.

Step 5 – Currently, the value of the property determines the authority needed to provide an initial offer (See attached Exhibit B – Comparison Table) and, if necessary, the Initial Offer may need OECI and MDX Board approval. It should be noted that Staff prepares an AIR which has an appraiser's certificate of value for each individual parcel for approval of the Initial Offer. Once the Initial Offer is approved by the Committee or MDX Board, Staff then begins with the process of acquiring property. Property is acquired through a negotiated conveyance or eminent domain litigation.

Staff feels that Step 5 is redundant, slows down the acquisition process by numerous weeks depending on the Board's schedule and is not the most efficient and effective use of MDX resources. Therefore, Staff proposes a slight change to the acquisition process which would avoid Step 5.

Property Acquisition

As stated, the value of the property determines the authority needed to provide an initial offer (See attached Exhibit B – Comparison Table). The current ED's authority to extend an initial offer ends without Committee or Board approval is \$350,000.

The proposed revisions will allow the ED to extend all initial offers when the initial offer is supported by an appraiser's certificate of value. Any property valued over one million dollars may be subject to a second appraisal with an appraiser review to determine the most accurate appraisal. The appraiser's certificate of value is the same document attached to the AIR for Committee Endorsement and Board approval. The MDX Board has never voted not to extend an initial offer based on an appraiser's certificate of value.

The ED's settlement authority has been slightly modified (See attached Exhibit B – Comparison table). On properties valued under \$500,000, the ED would have settlement authority up to \$125,000 which is an increase of \$25,000. On properties above \$500,000, the settlement authority is the same as the current policy.

Any proposed settlements above the ED's authority will be subject to a shade meeting.

Business Damage Claims

It is important to note that any real property taken during the ROW process that contained a business is subject to a business damage claim. The property owner is charged with presenting an initial offer to MDX and MDX has only 120 days to provide a counter-offer. Currently, like the value of the property above, the initial offer determines levels of authority needed to present a counter-offer (See Exhibit B – Comparison Table). The proposed revision is similar to the property acquisition revision above and will allow the ED to present the initial counter-offer only when supported by a written independent third party analysis of the claim. Initial claims of less than \$50,000 require written memorandum from staff, an MDX consultant or an independent state certified CPA. Any initial counter-offers above \$50,000 must be supported by an independent state certified CPA. The referenced documents are the same that is used to obtain

Committee Endorsement and Board approval. The MDX Board has never voted not to extend an initial counter-offer based on referenced reports.

The ED's settlement authority has been slightly modified (See Exhibit B). On business claims valued under \$500,000, the ED would have settlement authority up to \$125,000 which is an increase of \$25,000. On business claims above \$500,000, the settlement authority is the same as the current policy.

Any proposed settlements above the ED's authority will be subject to a shade meeting.

The current MDX Property Acquisition Policy is attached (Exhibit C). The proposed revisions were not the only changes to the policy as the policy was also reviewed for style, flow and grammar. The changes were so extensive that a "redline" copy would be extremely hard to follow.

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

Adoption of the revisions to the attached policy will allow MDX to effectively, efficiently and statutorily acquire ROW in a more expeditious manner.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The funds required to implement the MDX ROW Program are budgeted within the Annual Board approved Five-Year Work Program.

I. Purpose:

MDX may acquire rights, title, and interest in property as it deems appropriate and as authorized under Chapter 348, Part I ("Florida Expressway Authority Act"), Florida Statutes. All acquisitions of property shall be made with an appropriate degree of transparency to assure the public and MDX bondholders that funds are being put to their intended use, and that MDX serves as an exceptional steward of toll revenue. MDX will only acquire an interest in property that its Board deems to be in furtherance of a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program.

II. Executive Director's Authority and Discretion to Delegate Property Acquisition and Eminent Domain Litigation Responsibilities:

- (a) The Executive Director is authorized to implement right of way acquisition programs and to administer right of way acquisition processes in a manner consistent with this policy. Such authority includes, but is not limited to, all aspects of acquiring, condemning, clearing, and preparing property for any purpose authorized under the Florida Expressway Authority Act.
- (b) The Executive Director is authorized to appoint designees and assign responsibilities to implement any or all right of way acquisition programs, and to administer any or all right of way acquisition processes. References herein authorizing the Executive Director to act shall provide equivalent authorization to the Executive Director's designees.

III. Application of Florida Department of Transportation's Right of Way Procedures Manual:

MDX shall be guided by, but shall not be bound or limited by, the Florida Department of Transportation Right of Way Procedures Manual, as amended and updated.

IV. Advance Acquisition of Property:

- (a) The Executive Director is authorized to make strategic and prudent use of advance acquisition to acquire property or property rights that are needed, or which likely will be needed, for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program as long as such acquisition is done in accordance with either:
 - (i) Section 7.1 ("Advance Acquisition") of the Florida Department of Transportation Right of Way Procedures Manual, as amended and updated; or
 - (ii) comparable procedures adopted and utilized by a state, regional, or local governmental entity to acquire property or property rights in furtherance of a program to assemble property for a lawful public purpose.

- (b) Advance acquisition should not, as a general matter, be undertaken until a preferred project alignment has been identified in a project development and environment study, or through a similar long-range planning process. Acquisition of property prior to funding being programmed and budgeted for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program may be undertaken upon written certification of the Executive Director that "it is likely that at least some portion of the property to be acquired through advance acquisition will be needed for an MDX project within the next five years."
- (c) The total amount expended on advance acquisition during any fiscal year may not exceed the Work Program Contingency amount approved by the Board during that fiscal year.
- (d) Following advance acquisition of property, the Executive Director shall prepare a report that evaluates each individual property acquired by addressing the following factors:
 - (i) the fiscal justification to accelerate acquisition in lieu of waiting to negotiate under a customary acquisition timeframe;
 - (ii) a comparison of the rights, title, and interest of the property acquired versus the rights, title, and interest ultimately determined as being necessary for the project, and the resulting value of those differences;
 - (iii) the projected costs that would have been incurred if the property had been acquired through eminent domain, inclusive of estimated compensation and damages payable to the property owner, expected fees and costs likely to be incurred by MDX's attorney and experts, and expected fees and costs of the property owner's attorney and experts likely to be taxed against MDX; and
 - (iv) an opinion regarding whether exercise of advance acquisition for properties acquired during the reported fiscal year resulted in an overall fiscal saving to MDX.

V. Offer by MDX to Purchase Property:

(a) The Executive Director is authorized to initiate acquisition of property by delivering an initial written purchase offer ("Initial Purchase Offer") to the property owner. The Initial Purchase Offer must be in an amount that is: (i) based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report and supported by a review appraiser's statement, both prepared by independent state certified appraisers retained by MDX; and (ii) within the total budgeted sum for acquisition of property for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program, unless the proposed acquisition qualifies for advance acquisition as described in Section IV. The Executive Director may determine that two independent state certified appraisers retained by MDX each prepare an appraisal report when an acquisition presents complex appraisal issues and / or the value estimate of the parcel is, or is anticipated to be, in excess of \$1,000,000. Both

appraisal reports shall be reviewed by a third independent state certified appraiser who will determine the recommended compensation for inclusion in the Initial Purchase Offer.

- (b) Notwithstanding the limitation in Subsection (a)(i) of Section V above, the Executive Director is authorized to initiate acquisition of property by delivering an Initial Purchase Offer in an amount that is greater than its appraised value to incentivize a property owner to voluntarily convey its property to MDX when:
 - (i) the Executive Director has determined that incentive offers will reduce time, expense, and risk associated with property acquisition for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program; and
 - (ii) use of incentive offers are consistently and uniformly applied through a written formula for the benefit of all private property owners affected by a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program.

Incentive offers may not be utilized: (i) for parcels held in the public domain, (ii) to resolve a claim against MDX under 73.071(3)(b), Florida Statutes, for damage to a business, or (iii) to determine relocation benefits.

(c) The Executive Director is authorized to negotiate resolution of all claims for attorney's fees and costs under Sections 73.015, 73.091, and 73.092, Florida Statutes, presented by a property owner in conjunction with MDX's proposed acquisition of property under this section.

VI. Counter-Offer in Response to a Business Damage Claim Presented to MDX Under Section 73.071(3)(b), Florida Statutes:

- (a) The Executive Director is authorized to respond to a business damage claim submitted to MDX under Section 73.071(3)(b) by delivering a written counter-offer ("Business Damage Counter-Offer") to the claimant.
- (b) For any business damage claim that is \$50,000 or less, the Business Damage Counter-Offer shall be in an amount that is: (i) supported by a written memorandum drafted by MDX staff or an MDX consultant explaining the claim and the grounds to support the amount of the Business Damage Counter-Offer, or is supported by documentation prepared by an independent state certified public accountant retained by MDX; and (ii) within the total budgeted sum for acquisition of property for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program.
- (c) For any business damage claim that exceeds \$50,000, the Business Damage Counter-Offer shall be in an amount that is: (i) supported by documentation prepared by an independent state certified public accountant retained by MDX; and (ii) within the total budgeted sum for acquisition of property for a capital project within the Board approved Five-Year Work Program.

VII. Negotiation Prior to Eminent Domain Litigation:

Subsequent to MDX delivering an Initial Purchase Offer, the Executive Director is authorized to acquire property through negotiated conveyance. Subsequent to MDX delivering a Business Damage Counter-Offer, the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate resolution of a business damage claim. The Executive Director shall negotiate within the following parameters:

- (a) For property valued in an amount of \$500,000 or less (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to acquire the property for an amount up to \$125,000 over MDX's appraised value. For property valued in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to acquire the property for an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to acquire the property for an amount that is the lesser of: (i) \$2,000,000 more than MDX's appraised value, or (ii) 25% more than MDX's appraised value.
- (b) In defense of a business damage claim submitted to MDX under Section 73.071(3)(b) for which MDX estimates the damage to the claimant's business to be \$500,000 or less (based upon documentation supplied by MDX staff, an MDX consultant, or a state certified public accountant retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate resolution of the business damage claim for an amount up to \$125,000 more than MDX's estimate of damage to the claimant's In defense of a business damage claim submitted under Section business. 73.071(3)(b) for which MDX estimates the damage to the claimant's business exceeds \$500,000 (based upon documentation supplied by a state certified public accountant retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate resolution of the claimant's business damage claim for an amount that is the lesser of: (i) \$2,000,000 more than MDX's estimate of the damage to the claimant's business, or (ii) 25% more than MDX's estimate of the damage to the claimant's business.
- (c) Any counter-offers that not are within guidelines set forth in Sections (a) & (b) of this Section will be brought before the designated Committee for endorsement and then the Board for final approval.
- (d) The Executive Director is authorized to negotiate resolution of all claims for attorney's fees and costs under Sections 73.015, 73.091, 73.092, Florida Statutes, presented by a claimant in defense of MDX's proposed acquisition.

VIII. Eminent Domain Litigation:

The Executive Director is authorized to act within the following parameters upon MDX initiating an eminent domain lawsuit:

- (a) After MDX has delivered an Initial Purchase Offer to a property owner, the Executive Director is authorized to acquire any right, title, or interest in property by petitioning for and funding a court order of taking entered under Chapter 74, Florida Statutes. For property valued in an amount of \$500,000 or less (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to fund an order of taking in an amount up to \$125,000 over MDX's appraised value. For property valued in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to fund an order of taking in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to fund an order of taking in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to fund an order of taking in an amount that is the lesser of: (i) \$2,000,000 more than MDX's appraised value, or (ii) 25% more than MDX's appraised value.
- (b) In compensation phase litigation concerning property valued in an amount of \$500,000 or less (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of compensation payable in an amount up to \$125,000 over MDX's appraised value. In compensation phase litigation concerning property valued in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of compensation phase litigation concerning property valued in an amount that exceeds \$500,000 (based on a certificate of value from a written appraisal report prepared by an independent state certified appraiser retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of compensation payable for an amount that is the lesser of: (i) \$2,000,000 more than MDX's appraised value, or (ii) 25% more than MDX's appraised value.
- In defense of a business damage claim submitted to MDX under Section (c) 73.071(3)(b) for which MDX estimates the damage to the claimant's business to be \$500,000 or less (based upon documentation supplied by MDX staff, an MDX consultant, or a state certified public accountant retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of the business damage claim for an amount up to \$125,000 more than MDX's estimate of damage to the claimant's In defense of a business damage claim submitted under Section business. 73.071(3)(b) for which MDX estimates the damage to the claimant's business exceeds \$500,000 (based upon documentation supplied by a state certified public accountant retained by MDX), the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of the claimant's business damage claim for an amount that is the lesser of: (i) \$2,000,000 more than MDX's estimate of the damage to the claimant's business, or (ii) 25% more than MDX's estimate of the damage to the claimant's business.
- (d) Any settlements that not are within guidelines set forth in Sections (a), (b) & (c) of this Section will be the subject of a "Shade" meeting.
- (e) The Executive Director is authorized to negotiate settlement of all claims for attorney's fees and costs under Sections 73.091 and 73.092, Florida Statutes, presented by a claimant in defense of eminent domain litigation initiated by MDX.

IX. Relocation:

The Executive Director is authorized to implement relocation programs, administer relocation efforts, provide relocation advisory services, and process relocation payments and expenses in conjunction with other responsibilities under the terms of this policy.

X. Consistent Interpretation with Other MDX Policies:

This policy shall be construed in a manner that is consistent with other MDX policies that exist upon the adoption date of this policy, and that is consistent with such policies as may be adopted or amended subsequent to adoption of this policy. This policy shall be interpreted and applied in a manner that supplements other MDX policies and avoids, whenever possible, contradiction of another MDX policy.

XI. Effective Date:

This policy shall become effective as of the date on which it is adopted by MDX's Board of Directors, and at such time this policy rescinds all prior policies relating to property acquisition by MDX.

MIAMI-DADE EXPRESSWAY AUTHORITY PROPERTY ACOUISITION POLICY

PURPOSE

It is the policy of the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority to acquire property in an economical and efficient manner pursuant to MDX's statutorily authorized purposes. All acquisitions of real property will be made with the appropriate and lawful degree of transparency to assure the general public and MDX bondholders that MDX funds are being put to their highest and best use and that MDX is an exceptional steward of toll revenues.

MDX will only acquire interests in real property that MDX deems to be in furtherance of the Board approved Work Program. All acquisitions will be made in accordance with this Policy, pursuant to the requirements under Florida Statutes Chapter 348, Part 1, and MDX's Trust Indenture, if applicable.

PROCEDURES

Unless otherwise specified within this Policy, MDX shall be guided, but not bound by or limited by, the Florida Department of Transportation's Right-of-Way Procedures Manual (Topic No. 575-000-000) and Guidance Documents, including all amendments thereto.

The Executive Director may, in writing and on a project specific basis, delineate which guidelines shall govern MDX's acquisition of real property under Section 348.0008 ("Acquisition of Lands and Property"), Florida Statutes.

SPECIFIC REOUIREMENTS

- 1. <u>Definitions.</u> (Reserved)
- 2. Character of Property Interest Acquired.

The preferred interest in property acquired by MDX will be fee simple. However, where it is determined that fee simple interest in acquired land is unnecessary, is not economically feasible or is not advantageous to MDX, an alternative property interest, such as, but not limited to an easement, may be acquired.

3. Support for Value of Property Acquired.

Unless specifically authorized by the MDX Board, any property acquired must first have been the subject of an independent appraisal made in accordance with Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) standards. MDX shall not be limited by, but rather shall be guided by the appraised value of the property, in its determination of the value to pay for the property to be acquired. MDX is free to exercise its discretion in determining whether to acquire the property for more or less than the appraisal report value of the

property.

4. Support for Business Damages.

Unless specifically authorized otherwise by the MDX Board, all business damage settlements less than \$25,000 must be reviewed by Staff. All claims greater than \$25,000 must be reviewed by a Certified Public Accountant in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. MDX shall not be limited by, but rather shall be guided by the Staff analysis or Certified Public Accountant review, in its determination of the amount to pay for business damage claims.

5. Support for Relocation Costs.

Unless specifically authorized otherwise by the MDX Board, all relocation payments shall be in compliance with procedural guidelines as adopted by the MDX Board.

6. Advanced Acquisition.

In order to optimize costs and time savings in the acquisition of real property, MDX may make strategic and prudent use of Advanced Acquisition of real property needed for an MDX Project(s).

a. Timing for Advanced Acquisition.

As a general matter, the advanced acquisition of right of way should not be undertaken until, at a minimum, a preferred alignment has been identified in a PD&E study or other similar planning activity. Acquisition of right of way prior to a programmed and budgeted MDX Work Program Right of Way Phase must be made pursuant to a certification by the MDX Director of Engineering that he or she "has a reasonable belief that at least some portion of the property to be acquired will be needed for an MDX project within not more than the next 5 years and shall not be held for a transportation project longer than 10 years without specific review and concurrence by the Operations Committee."

b. Prioritization Criteria for Advanced Acquisition.

The criteria listed below is not absolute or limiting, but is intended to convey the Board's policy as to the type of purchase that should be given the greatest consideration.

- 1. High degree of certainty that property will be needed within 3 years.
- 2. Property offered for sale on open market where offered sales price does not exceed appraised value by more than 5%.
- 3. Residential property, not currently offered for sale on the open market, but is either in or at risk of foreclosure.

- 4. Residential property, not currently offered for sale on the open market, where property can be leased back to owner to maintain occupancy and former owner/occupant indemnifies and insures MDX as a named "other insured."
- 5. Commercial property, not currently offered for sale on the open market, but imminent development or improvement plans exist that would significantly increase MDX's future acquisition costs, and where such plans are adequately documented.

c. Limitations

The total amount expended on Advanced Acquisition of Property in any Fiscal Year shall not exceed 25% of the Work Program Contingency approved by the MDX Board for that Fiscal Year.

d. Subsequent Year Program Evaluation and Report to MDX Board.

In any fiscal year, following the acquisition of any property acquired pursuant to this Advanced Acquisition Section, MDX's General Engineering Consultant shall present a report to the MDX Board that reflects the following analyses for individual properties acquired, as well as for the overall program:

- 1. Property purchase price compared to the estimated value at the time the property would likely have been acquired via a typical right of way phase.
- 2. A comparison of the physical elements of the property acquired against those which were finally needed for the project and the cost differential related to those physical element differentials.
- 3. Projected costs that would have been incurred should the property have been acquired through an eminent domain process. This must include but not be limited to: owner and MDX attorney fees, litigation costs, costs to cure, severance damages, business damages, and cost of funds related to good faith court deposits.
- 4. A conclusion as to whether the Advanced Acquisition of Properties for the reporting year resulted in an overall cost savings to MDX.
- 5. Organization and Coordination of Property Acquisition during the MDX Right of Way Phase

7. Documentation of Negotiations.

The negotiations relating to all MDX property acquisitions shall be reduced to writing and shall for each parcel negotiated reflect, at a minimum, the following:

a. The date, time and place of the contact.

- b. All persons present or involved in the contact.
- c. Offers made and discussed.
- d. Counter offers made and discussed.
- e. Results of the discussions.
- f. Any other information pertinent to the negotiation and/or settlement of the property purchase.

DELEGATED AUTHORITIES FOR PROPERTY ACQUISITION

- 1. Administrative Authority:
 - a. The Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, has the authority to administer the Right of Way Acquisition program including, but not limited to, preparing and delivering purchase offers, negotiating, executing purchase agreements and concluding property purchase transactions on behalf of MDX in compliance with applicable procedures.
- 2. Initial Offer Authority:
 - a. The Executive Director has the authority to make an Initial Offer up to the appraisal report value for the purchase of parcels pursuant to this Policy only when the appraisal report value of the parcel is \$350,000 or less.
 - b. The Operations Committee is hereby authorized to approve an Initial Offer
 and approve the purchase of parcels when the appraisal report value of the parcel is greater than \$350,000 but less than \$500,000.
 - c. All proposed acquisition of property when the appraisal report value of the parcel is greater than \$500,000 must be endorsed by the Operations Committee and approved by the MDX Board.
- 3. Settlement Authority:
 - a. For parcels with an appraisal report value that does not exceed \$350,000, the Executive Director has the authority to enter into settlement agreements that do not exceed the appraisal report value of the parcel by more than twenty-five per cent (25%) or do not exceed the appraised value of the parcel by \$100,000, whichever is greater- (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs). For all other parcel acquisitions, the Executive Director has the authority to enter into settlement agreements that do not exceed the parcel's appraisal report value by more than twenty-five percent (25%) or up to two million dollars (\$2,000,000), whichever is less (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs).
- 4. If applicable, pay the property owner's attorney's fees and other costs in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 73, Florida Statutes.

DELEGATED AUTHORITIES FOR BUSINESS DAMAGE CLAIMS

In some instances of property acquisitions, there may be a separate claim(s) for business damages.

- 1. Administrative Authority:
 - a. The Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, has the authority to administer the Right of Way Business Damage Claim process including, but not limited to, preparing and delivering Notice to Business Owner Letters, receiving and reviewing claims, negotiating, executing settlement agreements on behalf of MDX in compliance with applicable Florida laws.
- 2. Counter-Offer Authority:
 - a. All Counter-Offers relating to a Business Damage Claim will be subject to the review as required by Section 4 of the Specific Requirements. No counter-offer will be made without the required prior review.
 - b. The Executive Director is authorized to make an initial counter-offer to properly submitted Business Damage Claims only when the counter-offer amount is \$350,000 or less (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs) based on the required review.
 - c. The Operations Committee is authorized to make an initial counter-offer to properly submitted Business Damage Claims only when the counter-offer amount is between \$350,000 but less than \$500,000 (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs) based on the required review.
 - d. All counter-offers greater than \$500,000 to a properly submitted Business Damage Claim must be endorsed by the Operations Committee and approved by the MDX Board.
- 3. Settlement Authority:
 - a. For a properly submitted Business Damage Claim whose initial counter-offer did not exceed \$350,000 supported by the required Section 4 review, the Executive Director has the authority to enter into settlement agreements by more than twenty-five per cent (25%) or \$100,000, whichever is greater, of the initial counter-offer (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs). For all other Business Damage Claims, the Executive Director has the authority to enter into settlement agreements by more than twenty-five percent (25%) or up to two million dollars (\$2,000,000), whichever is less, of the initial counter-offer (excluding attorney's fees, other professional fees and costs).
- 4. If applicable, pay the business owner's attorney's fees and other costs in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 73, Florida Statutes.

RELOCATION COSTS

Authority is hereby delegated to the Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, to:

1. Administer the Right of Way Relocation program including, but not limited to: preparing and delivering all required Relocation notices, receiving and reviewing Relocation claims, processing and delivering Relocation benefit checks on behalf of MDX in compliance with applicable procedures.

This Policy shall be effective as of the date on which it is adopted by the Governing Board and at such time this Policy rescinds all prior policies relating to MDX Property Acquisition.

<u>COMMITTEE HISTORY</u>:

Due to lack of quorum the November 13, 2018 OECI Committee Meeting was cancelled.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

Parcel 11205-158 is located at 3972 NW 36th Street and Parcel 11205-159 is located at 3906 NW 36th Street, both just east of Le Jeune Road. Parcels 11205-158 and 11205-159 measure approximately 11,857 and 62,770 square feet, respectively. These parcels have recorded access easements related to a South Florida Water Management District parcel totaling approximately 6,940 square feet. Both parcels are fenced and were used previously as a staging area for capital projects.

The parcels were purchased by the Authority as part of the MDX Project #11205 Interconnector to SR 112, which is not currently funded for construction. As required in the MDX Excess Property Leasing Policy, a market rental appraisal is being completed to estimate the parcel's current market value. This information will be included in the bid package.

The lease term will be three years with one (1) year renewal options and allows for annual rental rate increases based on the Revised Consumer Price Index U.S. City Average for All Urban Consumers All Items, ("CPI").

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

Entering into a marketable lease for the Property will provide a continued source of non-toll revenue.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Lease will provide the Authority with a non-toll revenue source.

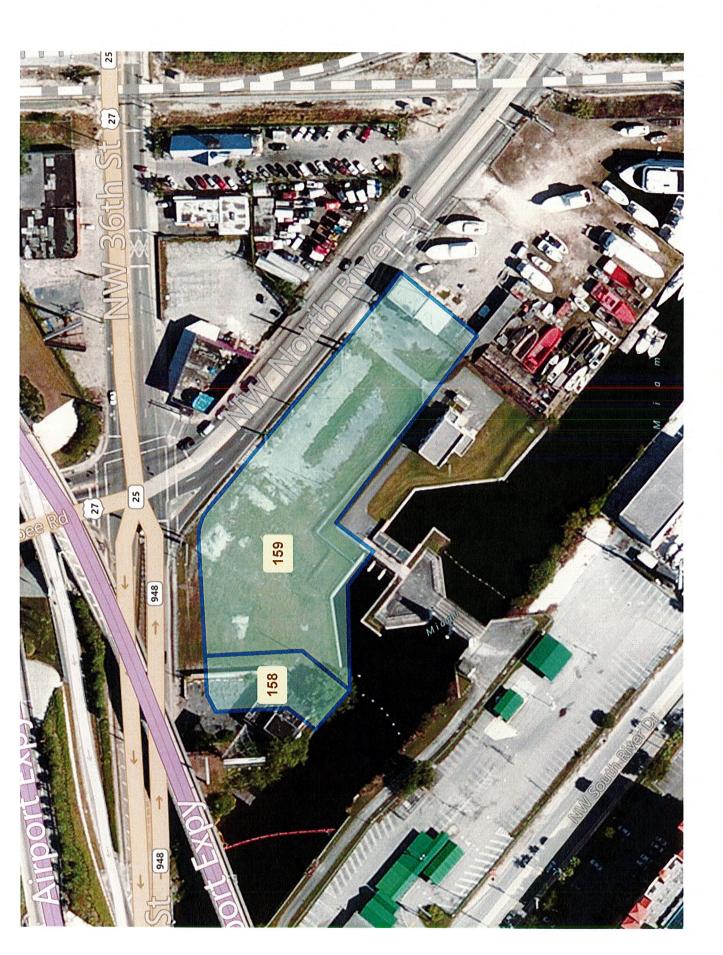

• Supplemental Agreement No. 4 to the Design-Build Contract with The Demoya Group, Inc. in the amount of \$862,221.58 to include the construction of the Interim Cure at the Miami Vineyard Community Church.

COMMITTEE HISTORY:

Due to lack of quorum the November 13, 2018 OECI Committee Meeting was cancelled.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

Staff is requesting Board approval of the requested action above.

On April 29, 2015, the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority (MDX) entered into a Design-Build Contract (the "Contract") for MDX Procurement/Contract No. RFP-15-02 with The De Moya Group, Inc. ("Design-Build Firm"). The Contract is to provide Design and Construction Services to facilitate MDX's Design-Build Project for the SR 874 Ramp Connector to SW 128th Street (the "Project").

On March 21, 2018, MDX obtained an Order of Taking which resulted in MDX owning Parcels previously owned by the Miami Vineyard Community Church (Church). As part of the payment MDX made to the Church to acquire this ROW, MDX paid approximately \$2.7 million to take possession through order of taking. This initial deposit was based on the estimates for right-of-way and cure for the damages caused by the taking of this ROW. During negotiations, the Church requested that MDX construct the portion of the cure that would impact the construction of the MDX 87410 Project (the Interim Cure). MDX agreed to construct the Interim Cure to ensure that MDX had control over the timing of this work, and to minimize potential delays to the Project if the Church did not implement the Interim Cure on their own in a timely manner. In addition, the Interim Cure work must be coordinated with the work of the MDX 87410 Project. As MDX has already paid the Owner for the Interim Cure work, the costs associated with this Supplemental Agreement will be negotiated out of the final payment for the Parcel during the Compensation Phase of the ROW Acquisition Process.

SMALL AND LOCAL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION:

Small and Local business participation in accordance with the original 15% and 15% Contract requirements.

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

By MDX agreeing to complete the Interim Cure for the Church, MDX will control the schedule of the work and avoid potential additional delay claims by the Design-Build Firm. It will also facilitate keeping the Church in continuous operation thereby eliminating the potential for additional damage claims.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds required for SA No. 4 are included in the approved MDX FY 2019-2023 Five Year Work Program. This Supplemental Agreement will increase the RFP-15-02 contract amount by \$862,221.58 to \$45,689,602.15. The amount of this Supplemental Agreement will be used to negotiate a reduction in the final settlement for the Parcels through either a negotiated settlement or ultimately through the Eminent Domain Lawsuit process.

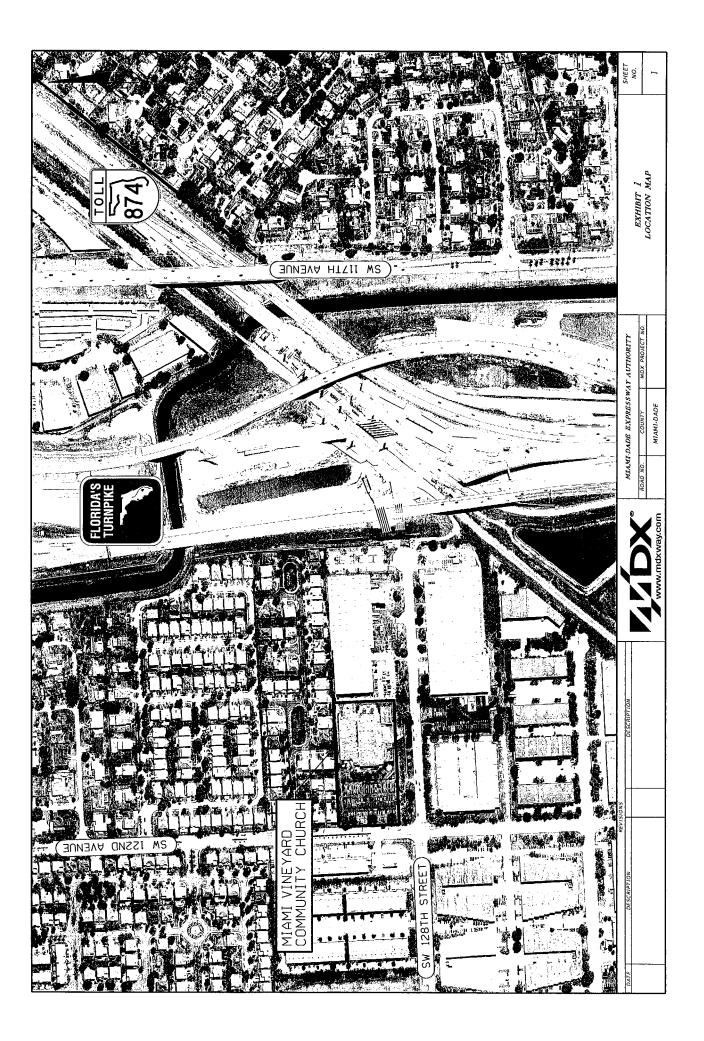
Exhibit 1 – Location Map Exhibit 2 – Interim Cure Work Site Plan

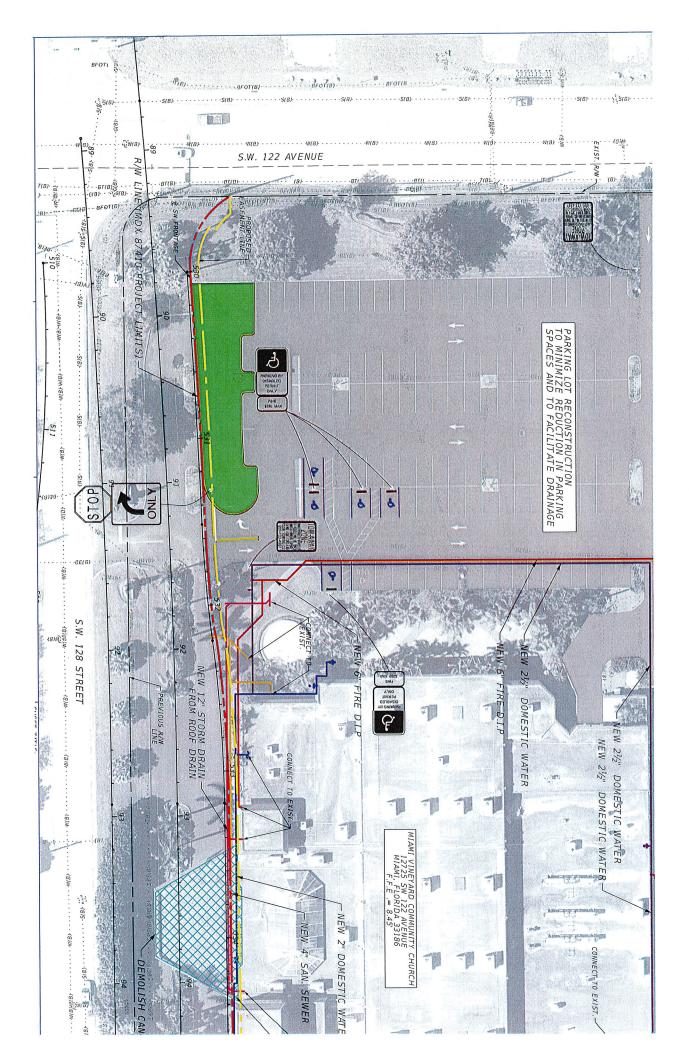

- SR836 WB Bridge #23 (870144) Deck Replacement;
- New 144 Count Fiber Optic Cable (FOC) Backbone for the MDX Operations Center;
- Wrong Way Countermeasures Infrastructure for Connectivity to the ITS backbone and MDX Traffic Management Center (TMC);
- Furnish and install DMS 836-08 Sign Structure and Install DMS Sign on Le Juene Road;
- 27th and 57th Avenue Ramps ORT Tolling Zone Improvements;
- 57th Avenue Mainline ORT Tolling Zone Improvements;
- Replenishment of Construction Contingency
- Credits and Lane Rental Fees

<u>COMMITTEE HISTORY</u>:

Due to lack of quorum the November 13, 2018 OECI Committee Meeting was cancelled.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

a) SR 836 WB Bridge #23 (870144) Deck Replacement – \$1,350,000.00 and 125 Calendar Days

As part of the Design-Build Contract, OCI is responsible for miscellaneous bridge repairs identified by the MDX Bridge Inspection Report provided with the RFP. Referenced report identified a requirement for surface deck repair as well as other minor repairs to the substructure. On July 16, 2015, subsequent to the contract initiation, MDX performed a regularly scheduled inspection that increased the required amount of surface deck repair required.

On April 28, 2017, MDX performed a visual inspection of the existing deck and identified that the riding surface of the structure showed evidence of severe loss to the

concrete cover protecting the top mat of reinforcing steel and concluded that it posed a safety hazard to the traveling public; OCI was requested to provide a cost proposal for a full deck replacement. The proposal for the deck replacement was submitted for \$2,634,084.74 that included a compensable time component. After negotiations, the agreed upon amount is \$1,350,000.00. OCI and MDX mutually agreed to a non-compensable time extension of 125 Calendar Days, which will not extend the current scheduled Project completion date.

b) New 144 Count Fiber Optic Cable Backbone for the MDX Operations Center – \$135,738.12

The original scope of work included the installation of a new (144 count) Fiber Optic Cable (144-FOC) beginning at the NW 57th Ave Mainline ORT Equipment Building (57AVE-ORT) and terminating at the NW 17th Avenue Toll Plaza Building (17AVE-ORT) along the SR 836 corridor. In order to provide redundancy within the system and provide an updated FOC backbone to accommodate new future devices along the SR 836 corridor, without undergoing interruptions to the ITS or Toll Collection system, MDX directed OCI to replace the existing 72 count FOC (72-FOC) from the 57 AVE-ORT to MDX-HQ and from MDX-HQ to 17AVE-ORT using the new 144-FOC.

c) Wrong Way Countermeasures Infrastructure Connectivity to Local Power and to the ITS Backbone and MDX Traffic Management Center (TMC) – \$76,487.31

MDX requested OCI to install conduit from the wrong way countermeasure signs to the nearest FOC splice box and to provide direct power connectivity to MDX service points. Additionally, OCI was directed to revise the engineering plans and implement the necessary civil infrastructure, at three locations, in order to allow MDX to install FOC lateral connections for future connectivity to the MDX TMC.

d) Furnish and Install Dynamic Message Sign Structure (DMS) 836-08 and Install DMS on Le Juene Road – \$345,616.83.00 and 45 Calendar Days

OCI was directed to install one Dynamic Message Sign (DMS 836-8) on Le Juene Road, to be provided by MDX, and to furnish and install a new sign structure to support the sign. Originally this DMS was intended to have been installed in MDX Project 10019.030 (System wide Dynamic Message Sign Implementation), but was found to be in conflict with the reconstruction of the new Le Juene Interchange under MDX Project 83628.030. A credit of \$377,818.05 was provided on the 10019.030 project to offset the costs on the 83628.030 project. OCI and MDX mutually agreed to a non-compensable time extension of 45 Calendar Days.

e) 27th and 57th Avenue Ramps ORT Tolling Zone Improvements – \$446,134.33

As part of the reconfiguration of the ORT ramps conversion, MDX directed OCI to add permanent backup power generators and shelters for the proposed 27A and 57D ORT locations. These improvements will eliminate the need for MDX to dispatch equipment and personnel during emergency events, as well as to prevent damage to the ORT devices

due to prolonged downtime or power surges caused by storms and to limit the loss of revenue during power outage events.

f) 57th Avenue Mainline ORT Tolling Zone Improvements – \$203,296.00 and 55 Calendar days

To provide Xpress Technology (XT) Lanes for the Express Bus service on SR 836, the Mainline 57th Ave ORT system requires installation of traffic bearing pull boxes on the shoulders. In addition, the current traffic loop layout requires that all the lanes, in each direction, be completely shut down to perform routine maintenance and/or repairs to the tolling devices and detector loops. MDX directed OCI to install a redundancy in the detector loop arrangement which would allow for quicker maintenance access and reduced down-time per toll lane in the future. This will require additional pull boxes, resurfacing of the tolling zone, and coordination with the MDX Toll System Integrator during installation of the new detector loops. OCI and MDX mutually agreed to a non-compensable time extension of 55 Calendar Days.

g) Replenishment of Construction Contingency – \$400,000.00

The original contingency of \$400,000.00 has been exhausted. A request is being made to replenish the Contingency to cover any additional changes to the Work as a result of unforeseen or field conditions associated with the Project. This replenishment is equal to the original \$400,000 available at Project inception.

h) Credits and Lane Rental Fees – (-\$598,200.88)

During the course of the Project, OCI removed or damaged a number of trees, whereby failing to comply with the previously established Baseline Tree - Relocation Schedule; as a result, OCI proposed to mitigate the loss of these trees by providing MDX with a credit per tree. A credit amount of <u>\$400,000.00</u> was negotiated for this item.

As a result of an overlap between the 83628 and the 83611 projects it was discovered that three guide signs located on an overhead guide sign structure were in conflict with the proposed construction under 83611. Based on the distance requirements for the installation of signs and in coordination with the 83611 Project, it was decided that it would be in the best interests of MDX to delete this sign structure and signs from the 83628 Project and request a credit from OCI. A credit amount of <u>\$185,700.88</u> was negotiated for this item.

OCI failed to re-open 3 EB lanes on SR 836, 1 lane on Ramp 42D, and 1 lane on Ramp 42B, on Tuesday, May 8, 2018, whereby causing unnecessary delays to the traveling public. The full EB SR 836 and corresponding Ramp closures were associated with the Bridge 8B concrete deck placement and which were scheduled to be opened to the public by 5:00 a.m. A back charge for Failure to Maintain Traffic in the amount of **\$12,500.00** (5 Lanes at \$1,000/first 30 minutes + 5 lanes at \$1,500/for additional 30 minutes) will be deducted from their Contract in accordance with Article 8-21.3 of the MDX General Specifications.

SMALL AND LOCAL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION:

The Contract requires a 15.24% Small Business Participation and a 15.19% Local Business Participation. The Contractor will continue to comply with the Participation Requirements of the Contract with the additional Work as added by this Supplemental Agreement No. 4.

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

The requested changes increase safety and efficiencies on SR 836, as well as realize long-term savings to MDX.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The funds required for this SA #4 (\$2,359,071.71) have been included in the current MDX Five-Year Work Program. The total amount of SA #4 represents an increase of approximately 1.5% to the Contract Amount for a new Contract Amount of \$154,604,212.39 and a \$400,000.00 Replenishment to the Construction Contingency.

Monthly Program Status Report October 2018

Transportation Improvement Program

Project #11212 – SR 112/NW 37th Avenue Interchange The project has been deferred indefinitely. ROW activities for the Parcel Swap are underway. Appraisals were received on 10/11/2018 and sent to the owners of the swap parcel. A meeting between MDX and the parcel owners is pending to be scheduled.

Project #83611 – SR 836 – Interchange Improvements at I-95

Notice to proceed was issued on July 18, 2018 to Archer Western-De Moya Joint Venture. The contract duration is 4 years and the project limits start at approximately NW 17th Avenue on SR 836 and continue through the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange along I-395 to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge. The limits on I-95 are from NW 8th Street to NW 29th Street. Construction for foundations will commence in February 2019.

Project #83618 – SR 836 Southwest Extension (Kendall Parkway)

Four different alternatives for two corridors are being analyzed. Roadway design is almost final. Reports for the different disciplines are being prepared. MDX-GEC has reviewed and submitted comments on environmental documents such as the Endangered Species Biological Assessment (ESBA) Report and the Wetlands Evaluation Report (WER). Reports for other disciplines such as Drainage Report, Bridge Analysis Report were submitted to MDX-GEC for review. Portions of the information for the Traffic Analysis for Phase II have also being reviewed by MDX-GEC, such as: a) DRAFT results for the existing conditions intersections and arterial analysis (AM and PM) b) 2050 Projected Peak Hour Volumes and d) Preliminary results for the Coordination with the SFWMD and US DOI is on-going as well. Continued coordination with MDC RER in support of the project's CDMP amendment filing is

still on-going. Coordination in preparation for Public Hearing is also on-going.

Project #83628 – SR 836 Operational, Capacity and Interchange Improvements

The Contractor, Odebrecht Construction Inc. (OCI) continues to work under Phase I of the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) which consists of the construction of an additional lane for the westbound and eastbound movements. They are also working under Phase II of the TCP for the reconstruction of the median barrier wall between NW 45th Ave and NW 57th Ave and the section between NW 34th Ave and NW 45th Ave is scheduled to be shifted in November 2018. This work includes full depth inside shoulders in both eastbound and westbound directions on SR 836 from NW 57th Ave to NW 17th Ave. This work is necessary for the new Express Bus lanes from the Dolphin Station Park and Ride to near downtown.

<u>NW 57th Ave Interchange to NW 45th Ave Ramps:</u>

At the 57th Ave interchange, work has been completed for the reconstruction of the 94th Aero Squadron parking lot with minor work pending to be done once the new Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) becomes operational (scheduled to be completed by the end of November). OCI completed the construction of the westbound retaining wall. This section of wall was required to complete the on ramp from 57th Ave to SR 836 westbound. This ramp has been opened to traffic prior to the DDI implementation.

<u>NW 45th Ave Ramps to NW 42nd Ave (Le Jeune Rd)</u> Interchange:

From 42nd Ave to 45th Ave (Le Jeune Rd Interchange), the eastbound SR 836 Collector Distributor (CD) has been opened to traffic including the new movement from eastbound SR 836 to northbound/southbound Le Jeune Rd/MIA. This opening allowed the contractor to demolish the existing bridges and foundations in the vicinity of the mainline inside lanes. As a result of this ramp opening, traffic weaving should be reduced, and traffic conditions improved in this area.

Monthly Program Status Report October 2018

<u>NW 42nd Ave (Le Jeune Rd) Interchange to 34th Ave</u> Ramps (14th St):

Roadway construction operations continue eastbound for widening of the outside lanes including base and asphalt placement in preparation to the MOT Phase II traffic shift in this section. Westbound from 34th Ave, OCI continues to work on the SR 836 widening that accommodates the new off ramp to 37th Ave. This includes construction of the new concrete barrier wall which separates the NW 37th Ave off ramp from the off ramp to NW 42nd Ave/NW 14 St. These two ramps have been partially shifted to the final configuration with some work still pending. OCI continues to work on the last section of the widening of NW 14th St now that the old bridge to MIA has been demolished.

34th Ave to 17th Ave Interchange:

In the eastbound direction, OCI continues working on the widening for the new outside lane approaching NW 29th Ave intersection. Current activities include construction of MSE walls, bridge work and drainage installation. OCI continues to work on the earthwork for all four quadrants of the NW 27th Ave interchange, as well as on the construction of the two remaining ramps to/from NW 27th Ave in order to complete this DDI interchange.

From NW 17th Ave. to NW 27th Ave westbound, OCI continues to work on the completion of the loop and the bridge for the 17th Ave on ramp to westbound SR 836. Various stages of work to include embankment, subgrade preparation, limerock base placement and final grade finishes are ongoing. OCI has also secured the forms and rebar in preparation for the placement of concrete for the decks of the bridges over NW 22nd Ave and NW 11th St.

The last approved Contractor invoice (September 2018) reflected a project milestone of 80.17% earned, 96.73% of the allowable contract time used.

Project #83629 – SR 836 – Interchange Modifications at 87th Ave

The Contractor, Odebrecht Construction, Inc. (OCI) continues to work under the Traffic Control Plans Phase 1A condition. The Contractor has completed all the end bents for the westbound bridges over NW 87th Ave. OCI has also completed the west end bent for the eastbound mainline bridge. Beam installation commenced for the remaining portion (Phase II) of the westbound mainline bridge and will proceed through the end of November 2018, which will also include the entirety of the beam installation for the westbound Collector Distributor Rd bridge over NW 87th Ave. The new ORT Gantry Building was delivered and set in place. Currently, OCI is working on the roadwork for the new gantry area as well as the grounding array for the building.

At NW 12th St, OCI completed the westbound shift to Phase 1A, allowing work in the median of the road. In order to perform this traffic shift, the Contractor completed most of the sidewalk and light pole foundations on the north side of the road. OCI also completed the shift of the new westbound exit ramp to NW 12th St. This allows completion of the pending work to permit the eastbound shift to Phase 1A, which is expected for late November 2018 and will provide access to the second end bent for the new ramp bridge from westbound NW 12th St to westbound SR 836. OCI has also completed the temporary signalization at the intersection of NW 12th St and NW 84th Ave as well as three (3) out of four (4) drilled shafts for the signals at NW 12th St and NW 82nd Ave.

Supplemental Agreement #5 has been executed by all parties.

The last approved Contractor invoice (September 2018) reflected a project milestone of 71.15% of work in place and 92.18% of the allowable contract time used.

Monthly Program Status Report October 2018

Project #83634 – SR 836 Ramp Connections to HEFT

The PD&E for this project is complete. The Design-Build solicitation documents are being finalized and the funding agreement between MDX and Florida's Turnpike has been executed as of January 17, 2018. The project's Design-Build advertisement is currently on hold.

Project #87410 – SR 874 Ramp Connector FTE Bridges:

<u>FIE bliuges</u>.

Bridge Substructure: Approximately 92% of the piles have been installed; 18 out of 20 foundations have been completed. A total of 18 out of 20 columns have been built. Also, 16 pier caps have been built out of 18. The overall construction of the substructure is approximately 95% complete. No work has been performed on the substructure during the past month.

Bridge Superstructure: Pre-stressed beams have been installed on 6 spans of bridge 12 and 8 spans (all spans) of bridge 13. Bridge decks 12-1, 12-2, 12-3, 12-4, and all 8 decks corresponding to Bridge 13 have been poured. Overall superstructure construction is estimated at 51% complete. No work has been performed on these bridges during the past month.

MDX Project:

Work on Segment 1 continued with drainage construction, water line relocations and roadway subgrade preparation, base construction, installation of signal mast foundations and pouring concrete curb & gutter. Construction activities are also in progress on Segment 2, water line relocations, drainage construction and bridge construction are among the activities this month. On this segment, a total of 6 drilled shafts for Phase I on this segment are complete, six columns have been built, construction of pier cap 12W2-5 is completed and 12W3-6 is in progress. On Segment 3, the Contractor continued working on bridge 13 foundations. Also, on this segment, construction of variable height concrete barrier wall on the southbound was concluded and roadway widening is in progress.

Project #87413 – SR 874 Interchange at SW 72nd Street (Sunset Drive)

The draft Interchange Traffic Report was reviewed, commented on, and is being resolved with FDOT. A revised Interchange Traffic Report that addresses all comments will be resubmitted to FDOT for concurrence. The project's Informational Meeting and Public Hearing will be scheduled in calendar year 2019 after FDOT has provided concurrence on the Interchange Traffic Report operational analysis for SW 72nd Street.

Project #92404 - SR 924 Extension West to the HEFT

The draft re-evaluation document was reviewed commented on and has been resolved with FDOT. The revised re-evaluation document will be resubmitted to. FDOT for approval in winter 2018. The project's implementation phase has been deferred indefinitely.

Project #92407 – SR 924 Extension East to I-95

Final engineering and environmental reports have been submitted to FDOT. Comment resolution meeting to resolve any outstanding comments on final reports was held. Consultant working to finalize reports based on FDOT input. FHWA has approved the interchange access of SR 924 to I-95. Project public outreach efforts have been reinitiated along the corridor and with pertinent stakeholders. Supplemental agreement for the FDOT Lane Elimination Approval Process has been approved. Additional scope for research into additional historical sites requested by FDOT is being evaluated. Continuing project activities have been placed on hold pending results of public outreach efforts. The project is currently on hold.

Project #92408 – SR 924/NW 67th Avenue Interchange The project has been deferred indefinitely.

Project 10017 – SR 836 Toll System Conversion

Coordination is on-going with the Civil Contractors for the civil infrastructure needed for the new toll zones within Projects 83628 and 83629. All new toll zones installed

under Project 83628 are in revenue collection. Negotiations with the Civil Contractor and TransCore for modifications to the existing toll zones at NW 57th Ave and NW 17th Ave are on-going. Installation of tolling overhead equipment for an additional westbound lane and shoulder is ongoing.

Project #10021 – System-wide ITS Improvements

This Project has been combined with MDX Project 30034 – SR 924 Milling and Resurfacing from SR 826 to MM 1.2 and with Project 40044 – SR 924 Drainage Improvements at NW 32nd Ave to install the Speed Feedback Signs. The Contractor's Notice to Proceed was issued on April 16, 2018 with a construction duration of 240 Days, which results in a Contract Completion Date of 12/12/18. The foundation installation for all six (6) Speed Feedback Signs have been completed. These signs are scheduled to be completely done by the end of November 2018. The Contractor's Final Acceptance should be given by December.

Capital Improvement Program

Project #40041, 40042 & 40043 ORT System Replacement on SR 924, SR 878 & SR 874

Coordination with the Contractor providing the civil infrastructure is ongoing. All toll zones on SR 874 and SR 924 have gone live. A walkthrough to identify punch list items has been completed; TransCore is working on correcting identified items. TransCore finalized the installation of ORT 1 and ORT 2 on SR 878, dry runs are ongoing. Installation of tolling equipment on ORT 3 on SR 878 is ongoing.

Project #40044 – SR 924 Drainage Improvements at NW 32nd Ave.

The Contractor's Notice to Proceed was issued on April 16, 2018. The Construction duration is 240 Days, which results in a Contract Completion Date of 12/12/18. The

pond area French drain work has been completed. Halley Engineering Contractors Inc. (HEC) continues to work on the material excavation from the pond area to get to the required bottom elevation and the top soil preparation for the sod installation. Current construction activities include the installation of the new drainage east of the SFRTA railroad tracks and slope restoration.
